- 4. <a href="KC REACHE">KC REACHE</a> an alliance between KCPT and several community colleges and universities to provide access to distance education programs and student services.
- 5. Osher Institute a unit of KU Continuing Education that is committed to creating accessible and innovative learning environments throughout Kansas.
