


DEFINITIONS & SOURCES Definitions: Poverty (County Level) is the estimated percentage of children under 18 years of age who live in families with incomes below 100% of the U.S. poverty threshold as defined by the U.S. OMB. Data

are based on the U.S. Census Bureau's Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates. The current rate represents the percentage for calendar year 2012.

Poverty (State Level) is the three-year average percentage of children under age 19 living in families below 100%, between 100-149%, 150-199% and above 200% of the U.S. poverty threshold, as defined by the U.S. OMB. Data are from the U.S. Census Bureau, Current Population Survey (March Supplement). The current rate represents the three year average for 2011-2013 calendar years.
