Dr. Virginia Moxley has served as the Dean of the College of Human Ecology at K-State since 2007 and as a K-State faculty member since 1985.

She has contributed to the field of distance education by fostering alliances for online learning that go beyond her role as Dean. She served as a founding member of the Great Plains Interactive Distance Education Alliance, a consortium of 11 universities, including K-State, sponsoring inter-institutional graduate programs, sharing distance education programming, and developing model distance education policies and practices.

Because of her leadership, vision, and commitment to distance education, Dr. Moxley was honored with the 2008 Faculty Service Award from the University Continuing Education Association.

Landon Lecture Series
General David Petraeus
Commander of the U.S. Central Command



Kansas State University will present a Landon Lecture Series featuring General David Petraeus on April 27 at 3:30 p.m. CST.

General Petraeus serves as the Commander of the U.S. Central Command and oversees United States forces in East Africa, the Middle East, and Central Asia. He assumed the post in October 2008 after serving more than 19 months as Commander of the Multi-National Force-Iraq.

The event will be held in Bramlage Coliseum on the K-State campus and is also available for viewing as a live video stream. After the event, the videotaped webcast will be archived for later viewing on the Landon Lecture website.
